Mahia locals were invited to address representatives of the HBRC and WDC regarding issues affecting Waipiata Stream and Kopuawhara River.

Waipiata Stream

Mahia locals outlined issues affecting the stream and surrounding areas and wanted to ensure that they were consulted and were able to work with the HBRC and WDC to mitigate as much as possible the issues affecting the stream and surrounding areas. Issues include Waipiata stream as a site of cultural significance and the importance of tangata whenua being consulted before any work can be carried out on the stream, rocks being removed from the stream, sand being excavated from the stream and not removed as this is a potential hazard for children, flooding to properties in surrounding areas etc.
