I would now like to extend a new challenge to the people of Te Wairoa: korerotia to tātou reo rangatira. Māori Language Week starts on Monday. The theme, Kia ora te reo Māori, was chosen to celebrate NZ's indigenous greeting. Also, the words "Kia Ora" are an exact description of the new partnerships for te reo Māori revitalisation between the Crown and Māori, under the new Māori Language Act 2016.

As many of you may know, Council has adopted its Te Reo Māori Policy and is sticking to the principles of this living and working document. For example, Council runs bi-weekly te reo Māori classes for those Council staff members who wish to learn our indigenous language.

Council would like to remind those owners who did not get the opportunity to chip their dogs that you will now have to pay \$35 to do so. You are still required to have your dog chipped. Any owner who fails to microchip their dog could face fines of up to \$500. Under the Dog Control Act 1996, they can also be impounded if they aren't microchipped.
