However, there were road incidents in the Wairoa district for the same period last year when one person was seriously injured and five people sustained minor injuries. Let's look to reduce those injury numbers to zero this year by making sure we drive to the conditions and respect other motorists.

Council's new Dog Control Policy came into effect this week. Please visit our website www.wairoadc.govt.nz for more information.

One of the biggest changes to Council's Dog Control Policy is that the reserve area from Spooner's Point to Pilot Hill is now an ON-LEAD AREA. In essence, your dog must be on a lead in the area between the Wairoa Bridge and Pilot Hill.

If you're a bit unsure where you can and can't let your dog off their lead around Wairoa, we might be able to make it easier for you.

There are a couple of places around the town where you can let your dog off its lead. These locations include the grass reserve on Fraser Street, opposite the Wairoa Landfill (near the old Wairoa cemetery), the launch area at Pilot Hill (so your dogs can go for a swim) and the road next to the beach at Whakamahia.
