The event will feature entertainment, a bouncy castle, stalls with a variety of food, as well as spot prizes and giveaways. The fun day is open to everyone and a great

chance to have a whānau day out.

NEW PRIME MINISTER

Congratulations to new Prime Minister Chris Hipkins. It is early days, but I have been pleased to hear our new Prime Minister acknowledging that the concerns of New Zealanders need to be listened to.

A change of leadership is a chance for a reset and for people to feel that their views are truly being heard and that, as a result of feedback, appropriate action is taken.

Of course, for me, the biggest win would be significant changes to the Three Waters. Under the Government's current regime, we will still all be charged for Three Waters delivery, it's just the invoice will come from a new water entity rather than the local Council.

If Three Waters goes ahead in its current state, the entities will be borrowing more money overall to bring Three Waters up to the required standards. Don't be fooled that the Government is investing in Three Waters, it is not, it is simply using these entities to borrow more money on your behalf. Plus, under the current proposal, New Zealanders will lose the assets they, and generations of their whānau have paid for, as well as losing local voice, control and democracy. I have always said the issue with Three Waters starts with the lack of Central Government investment. Shifting the problem to new entities that also need to borrow money is not a solution. The only solution is increased Government funding to subsidise the work that needs doing, much like how the Government funds roading.

My hope is that the Government pauses and listens to New Zealanders. We don't need new entities; we need the Councils which are currently delivering Three Waters services to be appropriately funded. That will enable us to keep control of local assets, our local people will have a say and we will retain our local knowledge and skill base. Under a centralised regime, it is very unlikely Wairoa will be prioritised above other bigger centres. We have seen time and time again that 'centralised' does not suit Wairoa's unique and isolated needs.

Communities 4 Local Democracy He hapori mō te Manapori (C4LD), of which the Wairoa District Council is a member, has stated that with Prime Minister Hipkins signalling a review of the policy agenda, he has an opportunity to deliver on Government

aims for three waters, in a manner that would bring communities with him. I know locally we are 100% behind taking a fresh look at a model for water reform.

I would also like to take this opportunity to acknowledge the work of previous Prime Minister Jacinda Ardern. I believe under her leadership there were some standout moments, including the Government's handling of COVID-19 in the initial stages, the Christchurch shooting and the Whakaari/White Island eruption.

EAST COAST FARMING

The East Coast Farming Expo will be held later this month, on February 22 and 23, at the Wairoa Showgrounds.

The Expo aims to connect rural communities with agribusiness and innovators and will feature exhibits, demonstrations and seminars for sheep and beef farmers.

This event brings forward-thinking speakers, who never fail to ignite conversations, sharing their valuable insights and breaking down barriers to help East Coast sheep and beef farmers make positive changes in their businesses. This year promises to be no different and those who take the time to attend this popular two-day gathering can once again expect to come away inspired, invigorated and connected.

Wairoa District Council will also have a presence at the Expo as part of our Council Roadshow to collect local thoughts and share information.

Wairoa District Council is part of a regional initiative based on how we can each play our part to slow climate change down.

Wairoa District Council has partnered with our local regional councils to bring FutureFit to Wairoa with the campaign being publicly rolled out to the Hawke's Bay region this week.

As FutureFit is rolled out across the region you will see posters, press releases and digital promotion. The goal is to have 5,000 people in Hawkes Bay registered with FutureFit.
